

17th March 2019

Who will save us?

Today as we look at the Cross as the means by which Jesus saves. In particular, he saves us from our sin. Sin pushes and pulls at us, at worst separating people from God or seemingly threatening and impairing the Christian's relationship with God. This challenge manifests itself in the world, the flesh and the devil. Each seeks to pull us away from God in various subtle or not so subtle ways.

The world does through the darker aspects of culture or trickery like moral relativism. It seeks to lay blame externals like class, money, gender, religion as the ultimate causes of evil. It pushes us away from God and seeks to use pressure to marginalize, humiliate or even vilify God's people as killjoys, troublemakers or dangerous.

The flesh manifests itself in familiar forms such as excuses whether through the veil of good intentions or circumstances. We buck pass, minimise sin's seriousness and so forth. We succumb to the challenges of money, sex and power, of passion and excess desire. We wrestle with fear, doubt, ingratitude, rage and so forth as they push us to doubt and reject God.

The Devil is not the supreme manifestation of evil but the first to succumb to evil as he desired to be god himself and so instigates evil by seeking us to think we can do likewise. CS Lewis wisely notes he wants us to either give him too much or too little attention. To paraphrase Monty Python his main weapons are deception, accusation and temptation. We thank God that Jesus came to save us from these things so that they need not rule over or control us. Instead, we serve the living and loving God of the universe.
