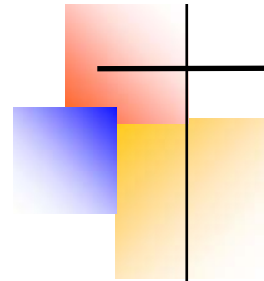

From the Senior Minister...

I want to tell you about an exciting new sermon series we'll be beginning together from the middle of this month called **40 Days of Love**. This campaign comes out of the same stable as the *Purpose Driven Life* course, which was written by Pastor Rick Warren in America, and in many ways **40 Days of Love** follows on from that course. Whereas *Purpose Driven Life* is about personal renewal, **40 Days of Love** focuses our attention on relational renewal. We are not to live our lives in a vacuum, so we need to learn how to only love God with all our heart, soul, mind and strength, but also how to love others as ourselves.

So what does the course involve? Well, during the course of sermons (and in Life Group studies too!) we will be unearthing the core of Jesus' ministry in how we show love to the people God has placed in our lives here on earth. How can we communicate more like Jesus? How do we love our creator, our neighbours, and ourselves? We'll discover together a love that is patient, kind, forgiving, and unselfish and always speaks the truth, all during this six-week journey into the very heart of the matter in **40 Days of Love**. And if you want to join in a Life Group to do this course fully (which I really recommend you do!) it's not too late – speak either to Lynne Smith or myself.

Remember Jesus' words: **"The most important command is this: 'Listen, people of Israel! The Lord our God is the only Lord. Love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul, all your mind, and all your strength.' The second command is this: 'Love your neighbour as you love yourself.' There are no commands more important than these."** *Mark 12:29-31*

There are lots of other significant things going on in October, particularly towards the end of the month:

- As you know, CHOGM is coming to Perth towards the end of the month. I urge you to get involved and pray for this summit as we are doing on Sundays and on other occasions – it is so important we pray for the nations and what an opportunity this is to do just that! As I said last month, go to www.commonwealthprayer.org to see how you can participate and see the events that will be on that you can join in with!
- On Sunday 23rd October it is **ChurchTogether**, a major event that combines many churches in Perth to have an act of public praise & worship of our Lord Jesus Christ. It is taking place from 6.30 – 9.30pm at G. O. Edwards Park in Burswood and the main speaker is Tony Campolo. Do go along and be encouraged in your faith as you join thousands of others! - On Sunday 30th October we are having another **Light Shine** party for kids here at KAC. We have done this for a few years now, and it is a great way to celebrate Jesus as the Light of the World at a time of year when it is particularly significant to do that! To help with your CHOGM prayers for Kenya from our own Kenyan family

Kenyans are generally peaceful and generous people. Please thank God for this. However, these problems plague our country and we would appreciate prayers on the following.

- A growing younger population who largely cannot find gainful employment remains a huge problem. This leads to petty crimes.
- Poverty and a widening gap between those who have and those who don't.
- The end of corruption especially among our Politicians and senior government officials.
- Rain for the eastern and northern parts of Kenya that are facing drought.
- Compassion and understanding for our Somali neighbours who are facing famine. Because of our own problems and the ongoing issues facing Somalia (war and famine for the last 10 years and other issues where Kenyans have helped out over the years), some Kenyans have become less sympathetic to the recent famine crisis. This has led our leaders to make the decision not to open a disused UNHCR camp in northern Kenya which would be ideal to house more refugees from Somalia.
- Please pray for God to bestow His wisdom on our leaders – from the President to our local Chiefs, that they may rule wisely and with compassion over their people.
- The health of the nation. HIV rates are falling in Kenya for the first time. Please pray this may continue.
- Ongoing education for all – this will help break the cycle of poverty.

Mission of the Month--Primary Chaplaincy
Mission Rep Dee Everitt

Report from Ann Clews, Yuluma Primary

Running breakfast Club is probably one of the most significant things that I do in the school on a regular basis. With the wonderful help of Alan Everitt, Breakfast Club operates four mornings a week. This means that there is always somewhere for children to come and have a meal before school if they need it, however, it also meets a social and emotional need through relationship building. School has to be a very disciplined environment and so I believe it is important for the children to have somewhere to come where they can relax. Thank you for all the additional food donations, which are warmly welcomed. Numbers fluctuate but there is a group of about fifteen children who come on a regular basis.

'Rainbows' is a grief and loss program and I have five children attending. We hope to increase the groups next year.

Pastoral contact seems to continue to grow throughout the school community as people get used to me and seek me out. I am also experiencing increased contact with staff. This takes the form of one-on-one interaction with students, assisting in classroom settings or with group activities.

I do a music session with two kindy groups each week, and also go into the year one and two class once a week working through the Virtues Program. Incorporating music and song in these classes has proved very popular and I am enjoying using my song-writing skills to come up with new material. I am helping to run a cookery class in conjunction with the ESU Class on Friday mornings.

In August I attended the school's year six/seven camp and found it most beneficial on a number of different levels. I have volunteered for more of the same next year and have also been asked to run a goal setting day for the year six / sevens before the end of the year to round off some of the learning experiences from the camp. I am also becoming regularly involved in various sports programs and carnivals as an extra body and helper. I am amazed how much I have been able to enjoy sports activities since I have never been naturally that way inclined. God sure is a mighty God!

I am convinced that prayer is vital to the mission of chaplaincy. There are so many things and situations that come along that it is not possible to plan for. I need to remain continually dependent on our Lord and Saviour to be able to work through this imperfect vessel to touch the lives of others and make a difference.
