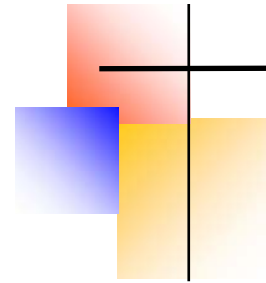

From the Senior Minister...

“Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age.” (Matt 28:19-20) Those are the closing words of Matthew’s Gospel, words we now call ‘The Great Commission’. They are words that Jesus spoke as he returned to the Father, risen and glorified as the Son in majesty. And they are words that remind us about our calling as the people of God; people who have accepted and experienced God’s saving love in Christ Jesus, who are then called to share that radical saving love, that *gospel* with other people. How can we not? God’s good news is too good to keep to ourselves!

That’s why I’m so excited that we are doing a course where people from both outside and inside the church community can come and investigate who Jesus really is. This course is called *Christianity Explained* and it is being held in church on Wednesday mornings. I really think this will be a *kairos* moment for some people we have been praying for some time, so please do pray that the course attenders will find real and living faith in the One who died and rose again for them!

This month we also continue our journey together in *40 Days of Love*. I hope you are finding the sermons helpful and challenging as we consider Jesus’ words about making relationships the most important priority in our lives: **“The most important command is this: ‘Listen, people of Israel! The Lord our God is the only Lord. Love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul, all your mind, and all your strength.’ The second command is this: ‘Love your neighbour as you love yourself.’ There are no commands more important than these.”** *Mark 12:29-31*

I also wanted to let you know that this month we will be doing the *National Church Life Survey (NCLS)* at church on Sunday 20th November. Every attendee at church that Sunday (including the older children!) will be asked to fill out a quite detailed survey about church and attitudes to church life. The NCLS is a national survey conducted across denominations and all over Australia to gain very useful insights and information about church attendance and church activity. The last time the NCLS was conducted was in 2006. I’ll be saying more about these surveys nearer the time!
