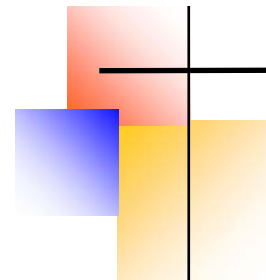

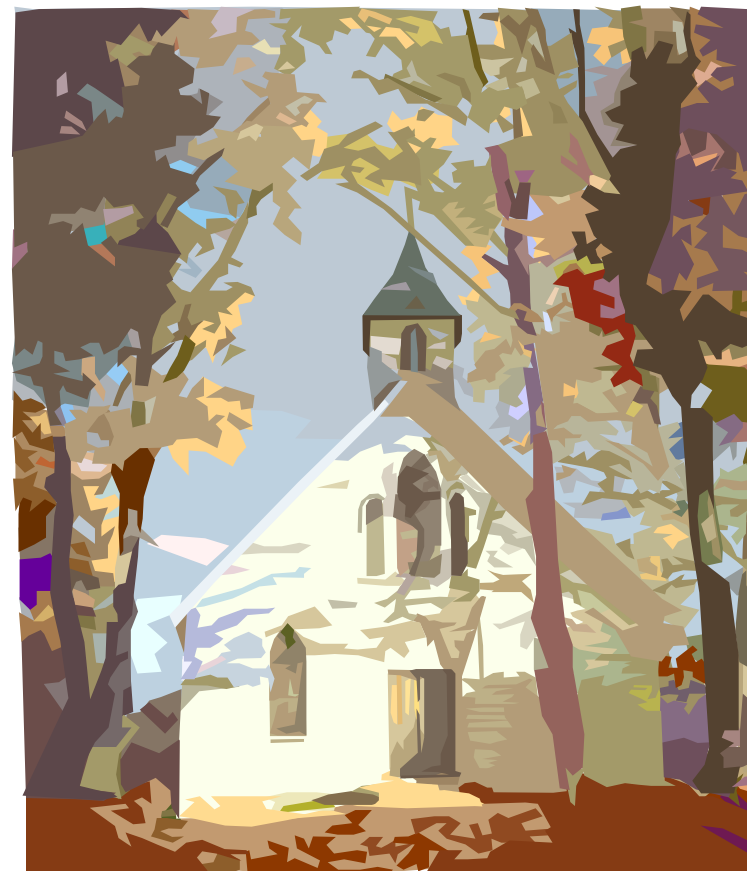

From the Senior Minister...

There are a couple of things I'd like to bring to your attention this month for your prayers and *active involvement!*

The first of these is **Back to Church Sunday**, which is on Sunday 11th September this year. **BTCS is based on the simplest step in evangelism – inviting someone with you to church!**

Please be praying that, as a church family, we will *all* take that small but significant step of inviting someone along to church *with us* on that particular day. This applies to all ages!! As a leadership team, we will do all we can to make those services accessible and welcoming, but this requires the church family inviting people along in the first place! *It is the invitation that is important:* people can simply say 'yes' or 'no'! Secondly, I'm sure by now you've heard about the **Commonwealth Prayer Initiative** that has sprung up to pray for the leaders of the Commonwealth nations as they gather in Perth for CHOGM (the Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting) this October. I've heard more than one local church leader say this is the most exciting prayer opportunity to come our way to pray for the nations in the last 20 years (!), so can I please encourage you, if you haven't already, to become acquainted with this prayer initiative and how we can join in praying for CHOGM. On that website you will find a wealth of info about the **Commonwealth Prayer Initiative**. Use it as a resource to help you in your prayers and to find out about the events that are coming up that you can join in with!

Part of the prayer initiative is that churches adopt a nation of the Commonwealth to pray for. As a church, we have opted to pray for the nation of KENYA. I was born in Kenya, so I have a special affection for that country!

Remember what Paul exhorts the young Timothy:

"I urge, then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for everyone—for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness." 1 Tim 2:1-2

To help with your CHOGM prayers for Kenya from our own Kenyan family

Kenyans are generally peaceful and generous people. Please thank God for this. However, these problems plague our country and we would appreciate prayers on the following.

- A growing younger population who largely cannot find gainful employment remains a huge problem. This leads to petty crimes.
- Poverty and a widening gap between those who have and those who don't.
- The end of corruption especially among our Politicians and senior government officials.
- Rain for the eastern and northern parts of Kenya that are facing drought.
- Compassion and understanding for our Somali neighbours who are facing famine. Because of our own problems and the ongoing issues facing Somalia (war and famine for the last 10 years and other issues where Kenyans have helped out over the years), some Kenyans have become less sympathetic to the recent famine crisis. This has led our leaders to make the decision not to open a disused UNHCR camp in northern Kenya which would be ideal to house more refugees from Somalia.
- Please pray for God to bestow His wisdom on our leaders – from the President to our local Chiefs, that they may rule wisely and with compassion over their people.
- The health of the nation. HIV rates are falling in Kenya for the first time. Please pray this may continue.
- Ongoing education for all – this will help break the cycle of poverty.

Project 54 and Prayers for CHOGM

project 54 is a yearlong venture to encourage prayer for the nations.
What started in one city, with churches adopting nations in prayer, is spreading to cities and nations all over the world.

Project 54 is about prayer

It is very simple. A church, organization or individual picks one nation and prays for it for one year.

project 54 is about the nations.

Jesus instructs us to pray for the nations: "My House shall be called a house of prayer for all nations" (Mark 11:17). The Commonwealth Prayer Initiative is one of many creative ways churches can be involved in stimulating prayer for the nations of the earth and their leaders.

project 54 connects us through sharing a common task.

The task of prayer is often overlooked and undervalued. It can also be easy to feel a bit isolated and disconnected from the people and issues being prayed for. By taking part in project 54 you and your church will be joining a formidable and exciting task force. As your church prays for its adopted nation, we can be encouraged that another church somewhere else in the Commonwealth is also praying for you!

project 54 educates, inspires and builds strong relationships.

The leaders of the Commonwealth of Nations seek to strengthen relationships across member nations, especially through education. We hope that through informed prayer you will become more inspired and educated about the needs of your adopted nation, grow to love it and perhaps one day even visit!
