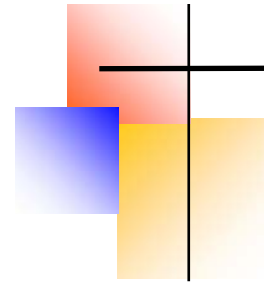

It has been an immensely fulfilling, challenging, varied and blessed time we have had being involved in leading this church, and we thank you all for welcoming us and making us feel so at home amongst you here these last four years. We have seen God at work in so many people's lives and that is such a privilege to be a part of! We know that God will keep on using this church to reach out to this community with the love and power of God - just lean on Him and trust in His strength and cooperate with His Spirit in all that He wants to lead you into next!

I am so pleased that we have been able to appoint Christi Phipson as the Children and Families worker at KAC. Christi will do an amazing job I'm sure to build on the foundations that Debbie and her team have started - so please do hold her in your prayers as she begins that role from this month onwards. Christi will be heading up both the Sunday children's work and the Tuesday playgroup, and as she settles into the role, she will be seeking new ways to reach out to young people and their families in this suburb. The Passion of Christ

**A spectacular Easter event
coming to the City of Perth
31 March 2012**

Many people are familiar with the famous passion play staged by the people of Oberammergau in Germany every ten years *The Passion of Christ* staged in England is a similar event with a growing reputation for theatrical excellence.

Peter Hurley's *The Passion of Christ* is part of a full length drama staged each summer in the United Kingdom over two weeks in the grounds of the Wintershall Estate, Surrey. In 2010 a portion of the play, the Holy Week and Easter sections entitled *The Passion of Christ*, was staged in Trafalgar Square, London, on Good Friday. The performances attracted in excess of 6,000 people and created stimulating media coverage.

The Passion of Christ will be staged in Perth in the early afternoon of Saturday 31 March 2012. This production is endorsed and supported by the Heads of Churches and will be staged by the St George's Cathedral Drama Unit using Western Australian professional and amateur actors, together with a professional actor from the United Kingdom portraying Christ, the role he has played in the London production.

His Excellency the Governor, Mr Malcolm McCusker AO QC, has graciously given permission for the use of Government House Gardens for the performance. The venue should accommodate about 3,000 people. It is anticipated the performance will provide an opportunity for the active participation of more than 200 people in the production and the producer intends searching for participants from across the metropolitan area.

No entry fee will be charged for the performance.
Further details will be advised at a later date.
