Old Church — New Life

1st March 2020

God our Saviour in Old and New

In this Lenten season, we will be looking at various aspects of God the Saviour that points us forward to the saving work of Jesus on the Cross and how we're to respond to it. This week we look at the deliverance of the Hebrews from the threat of Pharaoh at the Sea of Reeds. We will look at events that become a pattern, at prophecies that point us forward to Christ and to a sacred festival that speaks of our continual need for forgiveness and salvation.

Through it in Lent, though we have an opportunity to look not just at the cross and Christ but at ourselves. We're mindful of our mortality, a direct consequence of sin, of our sinfulness and brokenness, of the call to repentance and change in the light of God's character revealed in his Word and through his majestic acts. John Calvin began the Institutes of Christian Religion with the understanding that our knowledge of God and of ourselves are both vitally important and very much connected.

This next few weeks as I have said may be a time when there is something you can do whether giving something up for the season, a bad habit, an indulgence and so forth. Find a good book to read on sin and evil, listen to some of the rich sacred music inspired by the events of Easter, read through Exodus or Leviticus or a good book on the cross like John Stott's 'The Cross of Christ'.

Lent is an opportunity to remind ourselves of the constant struggles we face from within and God's response that is our crucified and risen Lord. There are truths here we need to live our lives by and consider every single day beyond the Lenten season. So whatever we do, we do it in that spirit of repentance and faith that marks the Christian life.

Dear Friends, I had a good meeting with Archbishop Kaye just under a fortnight ago discussing some of my and our struggles with the Diocese over the last few years and months. We have just received correspondence from her and the Diocese that has directed \$10,000 to go against our debt to the Diocese to cover the back pay owed to Karen and Louisa. That portion of the debt has, in essence, been written off. We are now only a few thousand dollars in debt to the Diocese. Praise God!
