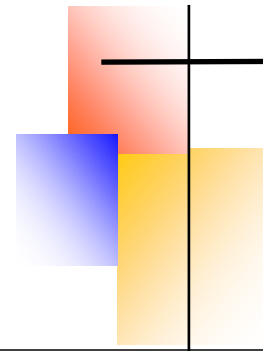

ULTIMATE SUFFERING

One of my favourite movies is 'The Princess Bride'. At one point the hero is being tortured and his scream echoes throughout the land. One of his associates hears the sound and recognises it as the cry of ultimate suffering. Easter draws ever nearer, and we too think about the ultimate suffering Jesus endured on the cross, leading to his death, and we also think about his resurrection, raised from death to life by his Heavenly Father.

Nonetheless as we look towards Good Friday its easy to reduce the event to Jesus dying on the Cross for our sins, but we forget the significance of the events leading up to his death let alone the nature of the cross itself. On that Friday Jesus experiences as much evil as any human being can at the expense of other human beings. That is part of God's plan hence his betrayal by Judas, Peter's denial, the disciples' abandonment, torture and abuse by the guards, the apathy of Pilate, the hatred of many of the religious leaders who conspire against him, the contempt of Herod and his execution as an innocent man as if he was the vilest criminal.

So it's not for nothing that the writer of the Hebrews calls us to look to Jesus as our great High Priest who suffered in every way as we can and who was tempted in every way as we are. Jesus experienced the full force of human evil and did so in order to secure our salvation, the faithful, perfect and innocent sacrifice who willingly gave his life for us so we could be reconciled to the living God, Father, Son and Spirit. This is the power of the cross, the wonder of atonement and the assurance of forgiveness that inspires faith, courage, hope and love all of which we see so astonishingly in our Lord.
