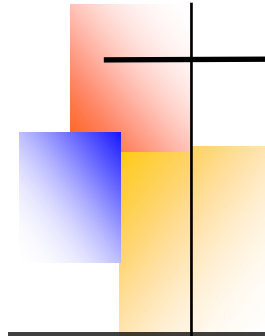

Why the Cross??

On Wednesday we looked at Psalm 51, that powerful Psalm written by David after Nathan rebuked him for his appalling behavior regarding Bathsheba. The powerful truth that lies at the heart of the Psalm is David's twofold realisation that firstly sin is so endemic to his person, at every level of his being from birth that he can do nothing to truly change or atone for his sin. Secondly he knows that the way forward can only lie in God, in his mercy, compassion and power. He can bring heartfelt repentance, renewal and restoration.

Ultimately we see David's prayer answered in the Lord Jesus, in his life and especially in his death. Why Jesus died on the cross is as important a question as who he is. Over the next few weeks we will look at the various reasons why Jesus died on the Cross including why the cross and not some other way of dying. We will look at the various ways the New Testament explains what Jesus did and how it benefits us. None of these pictures are mutually exclusive or contradictory though some are crucial to how God deals with our sin and brokenness where we cannot. Human beings found themselves in an appalling state as a result of the fall whether they knew it or not and the Cross is the supreme demonstration of the merciful and loving God who saves.

Church Matters

Michael mentioned a few weeks ago that the Diocesan Office were auditing the clearances that are held by each person who holds a responsible position in the running of the church. This includes the counters, prayer ministers, children's workers, welcomer's and so on.

At present we are working through the list that the Diocese has supplied and checking this with our records. It is pleasing to note that all who work with our children have the required Working With Children Check.

We are now working through the people who require a Police Clearance. If you are required to have a Police Clearance and we don't have one on our records for you, I will be contacting you with a form. If you already have a clearance (maybe for your employment) a photocopy of this is all that is required.

There are also a number of people who will be asked to attend a Churchsafe course that is run by the Diocese. When the dates for these are published I will let the relevant people know.

Please note that each of the above Certifications need to be renewed every 3 years but you will be informed of this when the time comes.

Lastly, we are each required to submit a Form 1 to the Diocese, if we hold any responsible position in the church. This is a one off form and I will have copies available for those who need to fill them out.

If you see me heading your way over the next few weeks, please don't feel that you need to run away. I am harmless and the process is not threatening!!!
