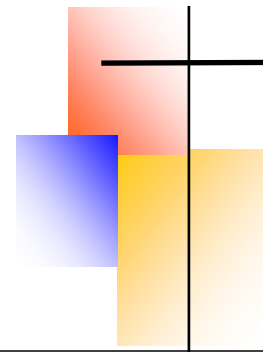

WORDS WONDERFUL AND WOEFUL

This last week a family in Queensland caught the nation's attention as family members literally tore a house due to be auctioned down in a dispute over an inheritance! How this family arrive in such a place we don't know but without a doubt harsh words have been spoken, resentments built up and rage released. Sticks and stones most definitely can break our bones, but words can also often hurt us and cause much more permanent damage than weapons ever can.

On the other hand, we also know the difference those three words 'I love you' can make when spoken by a lover, a parent, a child, a relative or a friend. Words can move people to acts of bravery, devotion, sacrifice and enduring legacy. It is in children as they grow up that we can see just how powerful for good or ill words can be.

As James reminds us of the power of words, it's also important to remember that the lack of words can also be powerful, for good or ill. Job's comforters were at their best when they sat with him and said nothing. On the other hand when people are struggling there is nothing worse than struggling alone while others stay silent for whatever reason. Even to say to someone 'I'm here' or 'can I help' or 'are you ok' can make a big difference.

God's Word to us in Jesus Christ means our salvation. It's with words we indeed can bring glory to God and edify and encourage others. We are called to be people marked by love, purity and righteousness. Such things as these are seen in our words and in our actions. In a world marked by distraction and triviality, by broken promises and empty dreams, words spoken truly, lovingly, faithfully and practically can make all the difference in the world.
