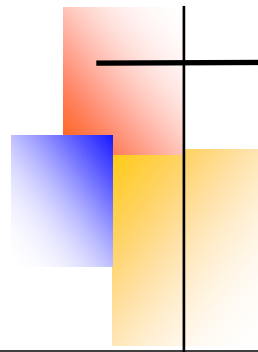

KINGSHIP, POWER AND PEACE

In the late eighteenth century the world underwent a seismic shift with the advent of the Enlightenment. It was a time in the Western world when reason, expressed in modern science, became the greater authority in how we understand the world and one another. One of the great fruits of the Enlightenment was modern democracy enshrined in the will of the majority and the rights of all minorities. Surviving monarchies lost almost all of their power and exerted at best a benign influence of the kind exercise by our present monarch. All forms of perceived totalitarian authority were rejected and derided no matter how seemingly benevolent. After hundreds of years and more of kings and queens and popes who used their power selfishly at worst and ambiguously at best the world was done with absolute monarchy.

As we think about Christmas and the birth of Samuel the Kingmaker, we can forget the impact of this change on modern ears when we speak of the birth of Jesus the King. In the gospels this king will come to usher in God's kingdom where he will reign over the world. That reign has been inaugurated in Jesus' first coming and will be consummated when he returns. Such talk is strange for people who have grown up in a democracy. Democracy is far from a perfect form of government but given the human tendency to abuse power when given it is the least worst form of government. Many of us are concerned about the erosion of genuine democracy over recent years because other alternatives open a dark door to oppression and chaos.

In contrast we can speak of Jesus' coming kingship with hope and confidence because his kingship will mean justice, peace and blessing for all, grounded in the grace and mercy that marked Jesus' first coming. Jesus' rule begins in the heart, hearts of flesh rather than stone who truly work for the good of all and the glory of God. I know I look forward to the day that day comes.
