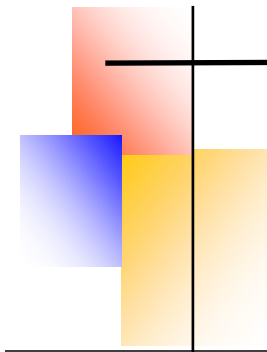

JEPHTHAH'S RECKLESS SACRIFICE

The events that surround Jephthah's sacrifice are representative of a man who was a schemer and somewhat self-serving. At the heart of the story in his conflicts against Israel's enemies there is faith in God as the one true and great judge over Israel and the nations. Sadly though in accord with his character even though he has won the victory Jephthah promises to sacrifice the first thing that comes out his front door that happens to be his daughter. There is the possibility that the sacrifice she makes was to refrain from marriage and live the rest of her life an unmarried woman but more likely is the fact that Jephthah literally completes the vow.

The conundrum that lies at the heart of Jephthah is that on the one hand he knew enough about Israel's history to know that Moab and Ammon's claim to the land was false. On the other hand he obviously knew so little of the law that he would know that the offer to sacrifice whatever came out the door was not only unnecessary and foolish, it was forbidden. Such appalling practices reflected the surrounding Canaanite culture of the day.

Part of the problem was that sacrifice outside of Israel was a means of seeking to either appease or attract the favour or to placate the gods. Sacrifice was another means of trying to twist a god's arm so to speak in one's favour. In the Law the sacrifices that were offered sought to atone for sin, the death of the sacrifice a substitution for the person or people making the sacrifice. It sought to enable an ongoing relationship between the holy God and a sinful people. So in the Lord's Supper we remember the sacrifice our Lord Jesus made for all of us, to reconcile us to God, God the son laying down his life in order to reconcile us to the triune God.

COVID-19 UPDATE

1. Sunday services can still be accessed through our new Facebook page 'Karrinyup Anglican Church Services'. Request an invitation if you are on Facebook and Kevin can give you access. The sermons are still available in audio as well.
