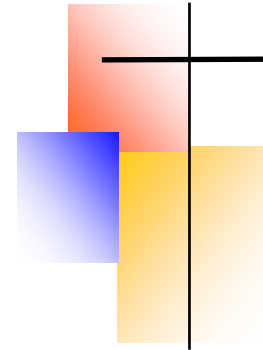

What would Jesus do?

When Jesus began his ministry he said to the first disciples 'follow me'. Those words speak not just of walking in Jesus' physical footsteps but of walking in his way of life and teaching. Nonetheless the apostles realised it is even deeper than this. Paul's remarkable 'hymn' in Philippians speaks to us of how his life impacts on ours.

The danger though is that we focus on one aspect over and above the others. Some focus only on the incarnation and baptism, on the call to identify ourselves with the struggles of others or the call to vocation. Some focus solely on walking a blameless life as he did in simple service. Others focus on the cross and judgment while others on the resurrection and new life. When each of these takes too much precedence over the others we risk it all. The young Luther only saw the demanding God of judgment and despaired. Peter Abelard reduced love to permissive sentimentality and some so emphasise victory the Christian life seems unreal. Jesus life from start to finish speaks to each of us in a more comprehensive way of following him.
