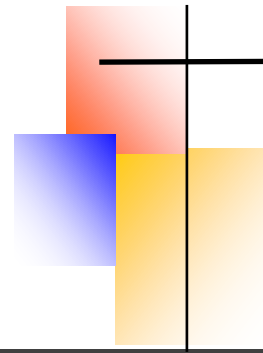

GOD IS FAITHFUL

When we read of the miracles in the scriptures, we often think of the miracles themselves, even imagining what we might have seen if we had been there. When we think of those who are the recipients of the miracles we only consider them briefly. It's obvious that a blind person receives their sight or a mute person their speech. In 2 Kings 5-8 God performs a number of miracles through Elisha some of which echo those performed through Elijah while others do not. What strikes me is those for whom benefit from the miracles.

There are those who are amongst the faithful in an apostate and rebellious Israel like the widow of a prophet whose son died or the prophets who move camp and lose an axe head. We read of those God blesses who are on the edge of or not even Israelites like the wealthy Shunammite woman or Naaman the Syrian. We then read of God's mercy to whole Israelite cities, of one facing an overwhelming Syrian army who are struck blind and left at Israel's mercy then mercifully freed. We read of another invading Syrian army ruthlessly besieging a city who are suddenly and inexplicably scared off in a moment, leaving some lepers to find a feast for a starving city.

These miracles remind us that God looks after his own, but they also remind us faith can appear in the most unexpected of places, amongst the most unexpected of people. Finally they also remind us that some miracles are simply acts of undeserved and unmerited grace and mercy. All through the scriptures they service as signposts to God's character, plans and purposes. They also point to the gift of life and peace that God gives in Christ to all those who look to him in faith, the life that comes from the God seeking to reconcile the world to himself through his beloved Son.
