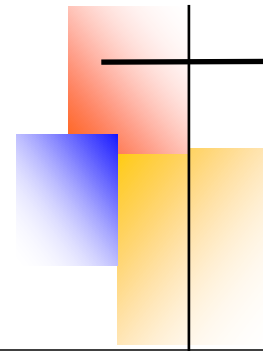

JESUS AND THE POOR

In the midst of Mary's act of beauty and wonder we see Jesus rebuke Judas' criticism by noting that the poor will always be with us. Was Jesus dismissive of the poor in making this remark! By no means! John tells us Judas' criticism, is actually a pretext for his greed but the challenge is not completely invalid. The challenge of caring for the poor is a very real concern then and now.

Elsewhere, such as in Luke's gospel we see Jesus' care for the poor and marginalised, especially for those who suffer at the hands of or are ignored by the rich and powerful such as the beggar Lazarus. In Acts we see wealthier church members caring for the poorer and Paul writes about the very same matters. James and John remind us of the need to demonstrate love in practical and unbiased ways, especially for those in need. The church has continued in this tradition for all of its history in one way or another.

Nonetheless the landscape has changed significantly over the last century or more. Much of the work the church did has been taken over by government and other agencies. We also know people fall into poverty for a complex set of reasons and help may be required in a number of ways, if wanted. There are those who need help through no fault of their own such as unemployment while others have become almost professional beggars finding ways to get money off people by playing the system so to speak. In Jesus' day many were poor due to physical disability such as blindness but now many are in such a place due to a raft of mental health issues. We neither do nothing nor do we try and save the world. As a church we do what we can directly and indirectly within our means especially for our own and do so in as spirit of wisdom, compassion and realism in the name of Christ.
