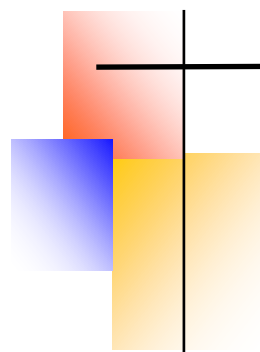

THE IMPORT OF HISTORY AND GOD AT WORK

Do you regularly read your bible? Do you read it on a regular basis? Does that regular reading of the bible include the Old Testament? Over the next few weeks we will look at Jesus' teaching in light of the two signs that were the feeding of the crowd and walking on the water. The discussion that follows is deeply grounded in the events of the Exodus and its key figure Moses. It's a discussion that makes more sense when we know our bible, even in its broad strokes.

When we read the Old Testament there are three key figures who we need to understand that are Abraham, Moses and David. In understanding these men, their relationship with God and the events that surround them, we understand Jesus for who he truly is. In particular when we think of Moses those of us who are old enough probably think of Charlton Heston and the Ten Commandments, of Moses the lawgiver and little more but there is so much more. Moses was the great Old Testament prophet, the model for all who followed. He was God's servant, a term used only for a select few. He was the law giver, but he was also the person through whom God revealed himself in the events of the Exodus. The prophets who followed him constantly called people back to the covenant God established through Moses. This is why this man is so significant

So when we think about Jesus as the new Moses and more, the mind begins to boggle. He is the prophet Moses looked forward to, the very Word of God, the bread of heaven, he brings and is divine revelation. He is all the Jews and Moses were meant to be and more. This is why we read our Old Testament and seek to understand how it is still relevant today.
