### THE QUIET MESSIAH

In the second half of Isaiah an enigmatic figure called the servant of the Lord appears. More often than not it speaks of a particular person chosen by God to save his people. The servant is somewhat paradoxical, a figure whose ministry on the one hand will be powerful and life-changing and on the other hand will be subtle and quiet. He is not a victorious figure and yet he will break the power of shame, guilt and sin. He is not a proud figure but God himself will exalt him. He was an unremarkable figure who would bring great joy and hope to so many.

The gospel writers and early church saw that Jesus understood his ministry as the fulfilment of the servant of Isaiah. The most dramatic example of this is Luke 4 when he reads Isaiah 61 in his home synagogue. Many were looking for the servant's coming but like the messianic hope it was one prone to false and unrealistic expectation. How could the servant take the form of an itinerant preacher and miracle worker who would die a humiliating death on a cross? In the light of the resurrection and their experience of the Holy Spirit the early church realised Jesus was the Servant sent by God to bring life then and now.

## Church Matters

During last month was the 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the consecration of the KAC building. The real church at KAC began back in the early 1970s when the dioceses built the rectory on the plot of land next to the land that had been purchased for the church. A Sunday service was held each week in what is now Michael's Office (originally designed as a carport). A large turnout meant that the sliding doors into the rectory's lounge room were opened to allow for expansion. Eventually the congregation moved to worship at the Limelight Theatre in Morris Place and later the move was made to the Community Centre adjoining the Karrinyup Library. It was a gift of \$50 000 from St. Columba's Church in Scarborough that finally got the ball rolling on the building of KAC.
