

Old Church — New Life

15th March 2020

A Harsh Reality and a Potent Hope!

Today we look at one of the most important events in the ancient Jewish calendar that was the Day of Atonement. Once a year the high priest went through an exhausting and meticulous process atoning for his sin, his family's sin and the people's sins. It reminded Israel and reminds us that no matter what we do, we CANNOT escape the reality and power of sin in our lives. It also reminds us though that God makes the way by which our sins can be forgiven. Guilt, shame and regret can be and often are a consequence of sin and God made and makes the way for us to move past it.

I am mindful though that there are times when we experience these three things as a result of unrealistic expectations. On a bad day we can be far too hard on ourselves or we will have been taught things that only encourage such unrealistic feelings. In moments of crisis, especially as children, we can also be manipulated or respond in ways that are ultimately unhelpful and destructive.

Nonetheless the scriptures are clear. We live in a moral universe, overseen by the transcendent and holy God who lays down the ultimate rules for how we are to live before him and with others. We do sin and put ourselves above God and before others and will experience genuine guilt, shame and regret no matter the games we try and play. The way forward, the hope in the face of such feelings and challenges is, at its heart, straightforward. We turn to and look to God in our Lord Jesus Christ who came to forgive, reconcile and restore and who by the Spirit enables us to live with and for him, to live lives governed by faith, hope and love instead.

Church Matters – Responding to the Pandemic

It is now official and the world is in the midst of a Coronavirus pandemic. I will be placing a copy of the Archbishops letter as well as more recent correspondence on the notice board. Some changes have been made to how I celebrate Holy Communion at both services that serve in part to stop intinction in any way. It may well be on occasion to hold services of Morning Prayer rather than Holy Communion.

Recent advice from the Diocese has asked people to consider not shaking hands at the Greeting of the Peace and to not serve Morning Tea unless a church can clearly and strictly follow the Health Department guidelines.

Can I please stress as of this moment that those of you who assist with serving at Holy Communion, Welcoming and other services that involve regular and close contact with others or food to wash your hands thoroughly before and after Church. We have soap in the toilets and kitchen and hand sanitisers placed at the entrance and near the sound desk. If you are not feeling well then seriously consider refraining from coming to church. There are ways you can organise your gift to the church aside from the offertory plate. This is a time to not panic but also be mindful of one another and let common sense prevail.
