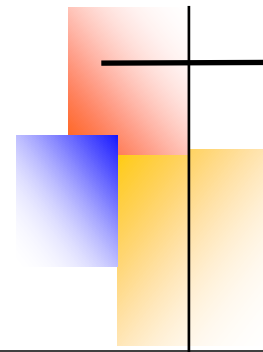

Questioning Authority

Authority in human society has been a given over the millennia, whether the authority of a king, priest or soldier and so forth. For many centuries authority was focussed on key institutions like the king or religious leaders. By the end of the 18th century fundamental questions over knowledge and meaning lead to a growing rejection of institutions as the focal point for authority. Authority was seen to be grounded in human reason, reflected in the growing importance of the sciences. Over time people became less and less trusting of various institutions and authorities. The revolution of the sixties with free love, psychedelic drugs, the civil rights movement and so forth came out of this. Some were important changes while others have proven more problematic. The churches were amongst the more significant institutions to be adversely confronted by the change and continue to be so.

As we moved into the 21st century postmodernism came to the fore in the western world placing the emphasis on the authority not of reason but of experience and towards the individual and the choices they were free to make. It became all about self-expression and the freedom to do so without hindrance in almost every realm of life. No institution, not even other people have the right or authority to tell me how to live my life. Ironically we are now also quick to use political force or social pressure to silence those who see things differently to our group. We have become both profoundly anti-authoritarian and very authoritarian.

Today's passage reminds us of the authority by which Jesus spoke and acted and, for the most part, by which we can act and speak. His authority came not from a role or institution or mandate nor did he claim it by virtue of a sense of self-entitlement. Jesus had come as God's divine and authoritative word to the world. His authority lay in his person, in his powerful words and in his actions, along with the witnesses to all these things. It's this supreme authority we stand upon, proclaim and follow in all things because Jesus is Lord.
