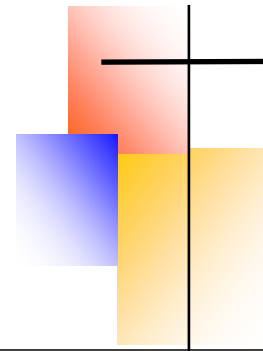

HISTORY – LOOKING BACK WHILE LOOKING FORWARD

Over the last few days between our time on Wadgemup/Rottnest Island and thinking about recent deaths including June Marsh's in particular, I'm struck again by a sense of history for myself, for our church and as a West Australian. June was someone who was a part of Karrinyup Anglican from the start. Next year will be the fiftieth anniversary of our parish as an independent parish and June was there from the very start. I remember speaking to her about her memories of services in the garage that is now my office, the community centre over the road and then in our present building.

While over at Rotto I was struck by recent changes that reflect a deep awareness of the dark side of the island's history, of its place as a cruel prison for many indigenous men, many of whom didn't understand why they were there and what they had done! We also heard stories of people who had lived on the island recounted by their descendants who are now volunteers, including a woman whose family lived off the island (we didn't find out what quokka tastes like).

Part of our faith, exemplified in Holy Communion, is the act of remembering, of looking back and recounting those events especially our Lord's death and resurrection, which we still participate in and experience by faith. We strive to learn the lessons of history both good and bad (though often not very well) as we look to the future. We also seek to avoid nostalgia by getting caught up in the past by reminding ourselves of the hope we have in the risen and ascended Lord who will return to renew all things. We thank God for the way we see him at work in days gone by and we look forward and look forward to the ways he will be at work in the days to come in any and all circumstances.

COVID REQUIREMENTS FROM DIOCESE
