

19th January 2020

The Servant King comes to Claim his Throne

Every time her majesty the Queen has come to Australia it's a grand affair whether opening the new Parliament House or attend the 2011 CHOGM meeting here in Perth. In our sermon series we return to the end of Matthew as Jesus enters Jerusalem picking up with Jesus' entry into the Temple, having ridden in on a young donkey. The King has come to Jerusalem to take up his throne, a throne that will be a wooden cross. The King comes to confront those who claim to speak for God without his authority, to challenge corrupt leaders and religious power mongers. Jesus and the religious leaders have been tiptoeing around one another but now the kid gloves are off so to speak. The Messiah comes and the apparent victory of his enemies over him only succeeds in being God's victory over the powers of sin, darkness and death.

As we work through this last portion a number of themes and ideas come again to the fore about God's presence with his people about true discipleship rather than cold ritualism and above love, justice and truth rather than self-interest, corruption and deceit. As the Lord prepares to take up his own cross, he prepares his disciples for his death, resurrection and ultimate return. We're reminded that how to be a faithful disciple of Christ means wrestling with how to live in the shadow of the cross, the wonder of the resurrection and the hope of his return to judge the living and the dead. History continues to move forward towards its goal that is all things restored to God in Jesus Christ.
