

An Open Circle

To talk about favourites is easier said than done. We all have favourite things, whether tools or toys, photos or memorabilia. Playing favourites though can become troublesome when we talk about people, a favourite child or parent, aunt or uncle and so forth. We can play favourites in church, spending a greater amount of our time talking with the people we're close to, familiar with and whose company we naturally enjoy. The reasons are many and complex and its perfectly natural for human beings to prioritise their relationships and their energy.

The story of a young Joseph reminds us the unrest it can cause, one of a number of stories of sibling or marital rivalry. Relationships fracture over time and families or communities slowly tear themselves apart. James reminds us that churches are often no exception. Some churches have an implicit 'inner circle', the people who have the pastor's ear. Different groups within a church have their own priorities or even agenda that runs counter to the concerns of others or even of God. There are the people who are isolated, ignored, even excluded for whatever reason, though 'class' is a common one.

James, like our Lord, reminds us that as Christians we are to be better than this. We go the extra mile in relationships, we look out for all of our brothers and sisters in Christ and beyond. The only delineator is whether they know Christ. If they do, they're family and if not, we pray they will become members of God's family by trusting in Christ. The church is at its best an open circle, people linking arms and looking out for others around and beyond the circle rather than looking in at the same, familiar faces. In this again we pray God's Spirit will help us look out for others in the name and love of Christ.
