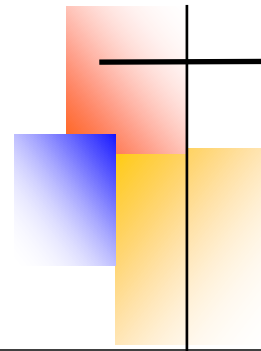

OUR OWN WORST ENEMIES?

As we draw ever close to another Easter weekend, we see in today's readings at both services those who were threatened by and opposed Jesus. They did so out of fear and rage, fearing the loss of prestige and power they had enjoyed and raging against this itinerant preacher who managed to outfox them at every turn, marked with an authority they did not recognise and understand. That fear and rage of course led them to ultimately conspire to see Jesus executed on a cross.

Such fear, rage and unadulterated self-interest lies at the heart of almost all conflict in our world today whether between individuals, within families, communities and across nations. Many continue to be amazed and astonished by the courage of the Ukrainian people. They fight a war only one man really wanted and do so tenaciously and bravely. Most people deep down don't want conflict or war but when someone threatens our home and family and community, what else can we do?

Sadly though, in the scriptures and history we see such conflict again and again, a reminder of the stark reality and power of sin that leads to so much trouble. The leaders of Jesus' day thought they had won when Jesus died but they served a grander and greater purpose in enabling the salvation of the world, seen today in the arrival of curious Greeks in John's gospel.

Though the achievement of the cross is yet to be fully consummated in peace and justice as we await our Lord, we work and strive for peace but there are times when communities must fight to live and survive. We pray for Ukraine, for an end to the violence and ultimately for Putin to repent or be removed from power and we pray and long for the day when God's kingdom will come, and guns and bombs will be turned into firewood and scrap metal. Maranatha! Come Lord Jesus come.
