

Old Church — New Life

20th September 2020

CHRISTIAN MISSION: AN ONGOING ENDEAVOUR

Today's passage is the passage I preached from when xxx was commissioned a year or so ago here at KAC. Both water and food, in particular bread, become metaphors for salvation and eternal life, the life we have in Christ through faith in him. The disciples are in a unique position as part of a new order grounded in Jesus Christ as the Messiah, a new order that arises out of the old that are the promises to the Patriarchs, the Law and Prophets and the hope of the coming Messiah, the great Son of David. All they looked forward to has come and the disciples and we are part of something new and wonderful. The miracle that is the Samaritan's coming to faith let alone the conversion of many in her community is an unexpected wonder. Their faith will stand in stark contrast to many of the religious leaders in John who see Jesus as nothing but a threat.

This passage reminds us that mission, bringing people to Jesus lies at the heart of the church's life and activities. The church at its best has been a missional church, passionate about Christ. Many criticise Christian mission as a means of colonialization and empire building and sadly there is truth to the claim. Nonetheless, many who live in countries that were 'colonialised' are thankful for one thing. Europeans brought them the gospel of Jesus Christ through which they recognize their receiving eternal life. Years ago our family found and visited a memorial in Old Fitzroy Crossing thanking the Presbyterian Inland Mission for their hard work. We ought to be mindful of the cultural context in which we live but in doing so we proclaim the eternal gospel nonetheless.

COVID-19 UPDATE

1. Sunday services can still be accessed through our new Facebook page 'Karrinyup Anglican Church Services'. Request an invitation if you are on Facebook and Kevin can give you access. The sermons are still available in audio as well.
2. We can now have up to 100 people attend provided we keep 1.5 metres apart from each other aside from couples and families. The chairs will be spaced accordingly.
