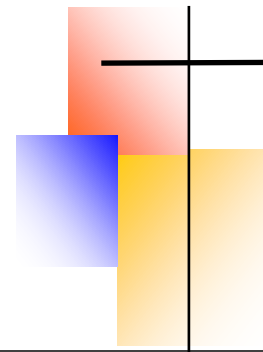

The presence of the Holy Spirit and God's omnipresence

God's omnipresence is His attribute of being everywhere at once. He is omnipresent even when we do not experience His presence; He is here, even if we do not recognize Him. God's manifest presence is, of course, His presence made manifest—the fact that He is with us is made clear and convincing.

God's omnipresence applies to each Person in the Trinity: the Father (Isaiah 66:1), the Son (John 1:48), and the Holy Spirit (Psalm 139:7-8). The fact that God is omnipresent may or may not result in a special experience on our part. However, God's manifest presence is the result of His interaction with us overtly and unmistakably. It is then we experience God.

The Bible records that each Person of the Trinity has made Himself manifestly present in the lives of certain individuals. God the Father spoke to Moses in the burning bush in Exodus 3. God the Son made Himself manifest through the Incarnation, as John 1:14 says, "The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us." On the Day of Pentecost, the Holy Spirit was manifest to the believers in the upper room: "Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them" (Acts 2:2-4). The result of the manifest presence of God in the lives of the disciples was a world turned upside-down (see Acts 17:6).

Theologically, we understand that God is omnipresent, but that fact is not readily discerned with the senses. It is a reality, but that reality may not seem relevant to the majority of people on the planet who have no sense of His presence.
