

THE RISE AND FALL OF EMPIRES

In the early 19th century Percy Shelley wrote the now famous poem 'Ozymandias'. Ozymandias was the Greek name for Rameses II, one of the more well-known Pharaohs. It's a poem that reminds us that empires may well rise and stand for a time, but they eventually fall and become little more than memory and rubble. Not that much has changed today. What has changed are the faces such empires wear be they corporate, political, ecclesiastical or cultural. Such an empire is being built across the road and it will generate both substantial opportunity and challenge in the years to come.

Today we see the end of a nation at the hands of another as Israel falls to the might of the Assyrian empire. It was meant to be something that would endure and be a light for God but sadly became anything but. At this point in the book the hope is that Judah to the south will heed the lesson but by the end of 2 Kings it is clear they do not.

Such uncomfortable realities then and now might give us reason to despair or not care but God will always honour faith. We also know that in Christ when he returns the enduring kingdom that is God's kingdom will come and justice, truth and love will be seen across the earth. On that day those who have lived by faith, showing itself in the fruit of good works and godliness, will be rewarded and vindicated. Jesus' resurrection was God's seal on his divine sonship and our resurrection will be God's affirmation that we too are sons and daughters of the living God. Empires come and go and especially so when they're built on questionable if not corrupt foundations. Then and now we live in uncertain times but in Christ we can look forward to better days.
