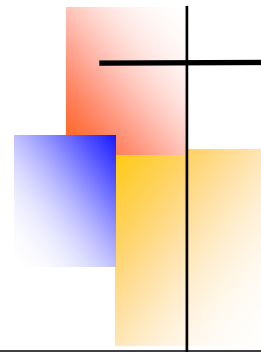

Old Church — New Life

NO SITTING ON THE FENCE HERE

For many people in and out of the church their view of Jesus is meek and mild, the adorable baby born that first Christmas or a man of gentleness and grace who almost never got angry or difficult or even firm. The Jesus we see in John's gospel is no such man. He is not rude or crass, but he is certainly not weak or tepid. Jesus is uncompromising as he begins to declare who he is and what he has come to do in the seven 'I am' sayings, the first recorded here in chapter 6. Claiming to be the bread of life and the call to eat his flesh and drink his blood were incredibly provocative at the time.

It reminds us that in a time where everyone tries to be positive in almost every way, when to be critical or negative is increasingly frowned upon, when the cardinal sin is to cause offence, to be like Jesus will mean going against such a flow. We should never be judgmental or excessively critical for the sake of it but there are times when we need to call out sin and selfishness for what it is. If we are to speak positively then we do so in order to promote faith, hope and love rather than speaking falsely or trivially. We speak with grace and love as well as courage and candour.

Anglicanism in particular over the centuries makes much of the 'via media', the middle way and there are often times when it's a good way to go but there are times when, especially as we speak of the gospel, compromise is a dangerous game to play. Jesus would not let people sit on the fence and when it comes to faith in him, neither should we. He came to bring life as rather than death, forgiveness rather than judgment, mercy rather than condemnation. Let us proclaim that hope with such love and boldness as we see in our Lord no matter what.
