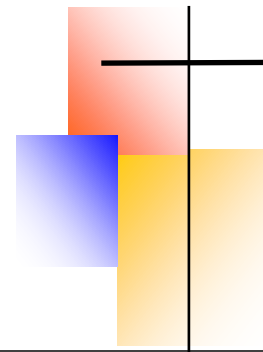

## GET READY, HE'S COMING

Advent formally begins today, the 4 Sundays preceding Christmas day. It's an interesting season that encourages us to prepare for the Lord's coming into the world even though he came two thousand years ago. Like Easter in a sense every day ought to be Christmas day. The Christian life is a life lived every day in the light of our Lord's coming, life, death and resurrection. Why focus on these life changing events once a year?

Advent, in my mind, can serve as a teaching opportunity, a moment to find renewed inspiration, courage, mindfulness and joy. Just what does it mean for God the Son to come into our world? What did it mean for him and for us? The incarnation is a miracle many dismiss or ignore. It's something that defies scientific explanation though I don't believe science gives us sufficient reason to dismiss it. The notion that the transcendent God who brought the universe into being might enter it is not so as implausible as it might seem.

The incarnation is also the first step in God's ultimate plan to reconcile a lost humanity to himself. Often the Old Testament readings include familiar passages from Isaiah, a book where the prophet constantly struggles to reconcile God's holiness and purity with our sinfulness and failure. Ultimately the answer comes in the servant God sends to stand in the breach for Israel and the world. That servant is Jesus, and his coming is the beginning of God's restoration of Israel and reconciliation with the world.

Advent is a season in which we can consider these truths, how they apply to us and how it is we can share these truths, these hopes, these realities with others. The light shines in the darkness and we bear witness to it. In all the trappings that come with Christmas, how will we grow in and share this Advent hope – the King is coming!

#### HOW TO BOOK FOR THE THREE SUNDAY SERVICES 8AM 9:30AM & 5PM

- You can register on <https://www.trybooking.com/BJRAQ> It is a simple process.
- Registrations are open from Mondays to Saturdays before each Sunday service and no registrations can be made on the day of the service. We will keep a record of attendance to be safe.
- If you can't register online and you want to attend you can register through the church office 9341 5572 Monday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday before 12 noon only.

#### COVID-19 UPDATE

1. We can now have up to 100 people attend provided we keep 1.5 metres apart from each other aside from couples and families. The chairs will be spaced accordingly. Communion will still be of one kind and good hygiene should be maintained before, during, between and after services. We will refrain from physical contact for the sharing of the Peace for the time being.
2. Again, if you are not well and suffering from any kind of respiratory illness or are at risk, consider staying home. Services will be streamed for a little longer.
