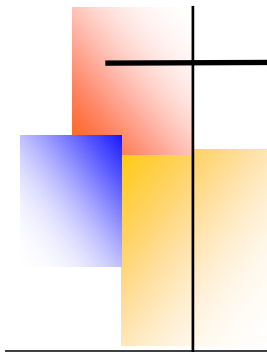

Old Church — New Life

30th August 2020

A WHOLE, NEW LIFE

Today we look at a familiar passage with some very familiar verses but again we must be mindful that familiarity does not breed contempt so to speak. It reminds us that being a Christian is, at its heart, something profound and life changing. In days gone by people would differentiate between Christians and 'born again' Christians. They drew a line between people who were cultural Christians and believing, heartfelt Christians. So many people fifty years ago either professed no faith in Christ but believed in Christian values or many went occasionally to church because that's what you do.

The danger with this idea now is twofold. Firstly, we run the risk of dismissing fellow believers as not born again because they fail to meet some other unhelpful or unwarranted pre-determined criteria in some way. There is no place for 'second class' Christians. You either believe in Jesus as your Lord and Saviour or you don't, however you may express that faith. Many in church are asleep in the light but we must be cautious about pointing the finger. We need only keep proclaiming the good news of Jesus Christ and assurance of salvation when we believe in him. Some come to that knowledge quickly and others slowly.

Secondly, we see successive generation no longer even professing any kind of faith at all, nor pretending to. Once again the spiritual transformation, the new birth Jesus speaks about with Nicodemus that comes when we trust in him is something that needs to be at the heart of our mission, ministry and life together because simply being a 'Christian;' will be that clear, distinctive and, if need be, confronting.

- Registrations are open from Mondays to Saturdays before each Sunday service and no registrations can be made on the day of the service. We will keep a record of attendance to be safe.
- If you can't register online and you want to attend you can register through the church office 9341 5572 Monday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday before 12 noon only.

COVID-19 UPDATE

1. Sunday services can still be accessed through our new Facebook page 'Karrinyup Anglican Church Services'. Request an invitation if you are on Facebook and Kevin can give you access. The sermons are still available in audio as well.
2. We can now have up to 100 people attend provided we keep 1.5 metres apart from each other aside from couples and families. The chairs will be spaced accordingly. Communion will still be of one kind and good hygiene should be maintained before, during, between and after services. We will refrain from physical contact for the sharing of the Peace for the time being.
3. Again, if you are not well and suffering from any kind of respiratory illness or are at risk, consider staying home. Services will be streamed for a little longer.
