The Way We Walk

When I was a boy a cool new cartoon came out called Scooby Doo. Before long a few of us were trying to copy Shaggy's very distinctive beatnik walk. The Ministry of Silly Walks is one of the more well-known and popular Monty Python sketches. We take walking for granted but in the bible, it can carry a deeper significance.

It begins in Eden when God walked with Adam and Eve in the garden before the fall. Exclusion from the garden for their rebellion meant that came to an end. Interestingly one of Adam's descendants Enoch is described as a man who 'walked with God'. He was spared death because that walk was so close to God. Noah is also described as such a man. When God calls Abram, he is called to walk 'before' him, a picture of faith that is used to describe those who follow him. After the Exodus walking with God means obedience to the Law given to them by Moses. When the monarchy is established the focus falls upon the kings and whether they walked in God's ways or in the ways of evil and idolatry. Wisdom Literature continues to draw on the language as a picture of faithfulness. When we get to the great prophets the language of walking becomes corporate and cosmic, but the enduring thread continues as a picture for faith in God and a life of godliness lived in response.

As the Gospels speak of the call to follow and walk with Jesus. Paul reminds us in Christ the Spirit of God who becomes the focal point of our walk with God. We look to the Spirit of God to nurture our faith, remind us of godliness, move us to love and impel us to serve. He is the Spirit of Love who leads us in love as we grow in faith and the Spirit's fruit, all for the glory of God.
