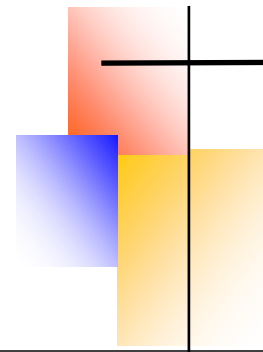

Cruciform Amnesia (or Forgetting the Cross)

As we consider yet again the events of that first Easter and in particular the cross, there is a question we ought always to ask each year – WHY did Jesus die and why did he die on a Cross? We know crucifixion was an ancient form of corporal punishment and a particularly prolonged and gruesome one, reserved for traitors and murderers, the worst of criminals. So again, why did a seemingly harmless itinerant preacher who healed and loved those desperate for such things die such a horrible and unjust death?

At one level we know it's because he challenged those leaders obsessed with power, self-importance, reputation and control. As we look at a hard portion of the prophet Ezekiel over Easter he helps us find a deeper answer to that question. He spoke to the Jews who were going into exile to Babylon. It was an act of judgment for centuries of idolatry, unfaithfulness, corruption and injustice. Their sins had deadly consequences whether the sins of kings, prophets, priests, elders, and ordinary people. That's what sin does, it separates, corrupts and destroys.

Why did Jesus die? He died as the supreme atoning sacrifice for our sins, taking our place so that we might live. His righteousness becomes ours by faith so that we can be forgiven and reconciled to the God we, like Israel, rejected. He died for the leaders who despised him, the Romans who did not understand him and for all of us who would rather live without regard for God and his will. I believe Christianity is at a crossroads, running the risk of forgetting how challenging as well as how important the cross is. We desire a faith that panders to our moral preferences over God's and our wants and desires over God's honour and others needs. The cross ultimately rebukes any such attempts and any such faith.
