A CALLING FOR US ALL

When we speak of calling in the church, we all too often think of those called to full time Christian ministry as evangelists, chaplains or pastors. The rest of us are not called in any such way. The apparent divide can be overemphasised in traditional denominations that make much of a sense of being called when someone applies for ordination. This isn't helped when some see ordination as the only means by which a man or woman can do serious Christian ministry.

One of the lesser known marks of the Reformation 500 years ago was the renewed respect for the concept of 'vocation' and the 'priesthood of all believers', pioneered especially by Martin Luther. Calling does not begin with ordination but begins for every Christian with conversion and baptism. Christ came to save us and in doing so God calls us in Christ to lives of love and service. As Paul notes 'whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.'

It doesn't matter what we do as much as how and why and for whom are we doing it. Whether one is a husband or wife, parent, child, homemaker, doctor, engineer, accountant and so forth, the deeper question is 'are we doing it for the Lord?' There are jobs as Christians we would not be involved in as they are clearly immoral but for the most part no matter how serious or seemingly trivial our job is, we are called to do it for God. In him we then do it for the love and service of others.

The impact we can have in some roles is obvious such as for teachers or nurses while others seem trivial. Nonetheless, how we work whether paid or voluntarily, our attitude and commitment can be a subtle and powerful witness to others that bear witness to our love for God and the Lord Jesus.

- Registrations are open from Mondays to Saturdays before each Sunday service and no registrations can be made on the day of the service. We will keep a record of attendance to be safe.

COVID-19 UPDATE

1. Sunday services can still be accessed through our new Facebook page 'Karrinyup Anglican Church Services'. Request an invitation if you are on Facebook and Kevin can give you access. The sermons are still available in audio as well.
2. We can now have up to 100 people attend provided we keep 1.5 metres apart from each other aside from couples and families. The chairs will be spaced accordingly. Communion will still be of one kind and good hygiene should be maintained before, during, between and after services. We will refrain from physical contact for the sharing of the Peace for the time being.
