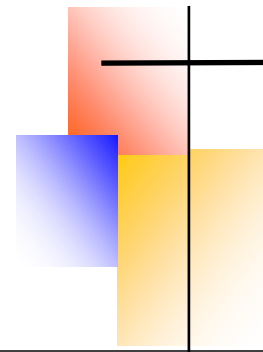

Old Church - New Life

James & Real Faith

For the next few weeks we're going to look at James. It's a book some have all but dismissed as one of the poorer letters in the New Testament, yet for many it's a personal favourite. Its sometimes thought of as the Proverbs of the New Testament because from start to finish it comes across as very practical. That is both an encouragement and a challenge. I pray you find it as such. Like other parts of scripture, it's a book that ought to shake us out of our complacency and selfishness as it was meant to with regard to its original readers.

The identity of the author has been debated over the centuries. One thought is that it was written by James the son of Alphaeus. Another is James the lesser, the son of Mary and brother of Joseph (c.f. Mark 15:40, Matt 27:56). It's also quite possible that these two figures are the same man. The other more likely possibility is that it was written by James, the half-brother of Jesus. We know he became a believer after Jesus' resurrection and then became the leader of the church in Jerusalem for many years until he was stoned in 62 AD. Though the letter is relatively brief, one cannot but think of the gospels and much of Jesus' own teaching.

James is also a book that had been pitted against Paul and his emphasis on justification by faith alone. The dichotomy is a false one. All of the letters we have in the New Testament remind us that faith, real faith shows itself in action, in love for the brethren, for the fruit of the Spirit, for godliness and purity and so forth. James is the most fervent in a way in teaching us faith is not just pious talk or intellectual assent. It's a relational faith that bears real fruit. If it does not, is it truly faith in Jesus? This question lies at the heart of this great letter.
