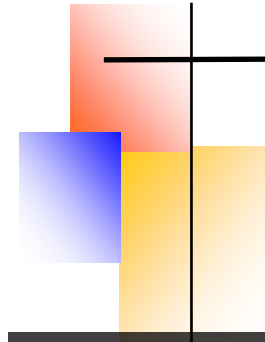

Slavery a thing of the Past?

As we think about the Cross as the means by which we are redeemed, we are considering a picture that historically draws on the past reality of slavery when human beings could buy and own one another. The phenomena of slavery is a complex one from the harshness of American and European slavery from the 17th to 19th century to the sophistication of slavery in the Roman Empire. Nonetheless by the 19th century thanks to William Wilberforce and others slavery seemingly became a thing of the past.

Sadly today slavery or the next worst thing that is exploitation still exists across the world primarily in the form of sex slavery and human trafficking. There are both secular and Christian groups who work to free woman and children especially from this abominable practice who you may already or want to support.

Exploitation is still a very live issue. The modern union movement began in part to protect workers and the vulnerable and at its best can continue to serve this purpose. It would be naïve to say the least to think that even in modern workplaces and businesses people don't find themselves taken advantage of, used and exploited. Natural justice demands that all people regardless of their economic status should be treated with respect.

Nonetheless redemption serves as a powerful picture of the salvation won for us in Christ who has freed us from the powers of darkness so that we might serve God in grace and truth, and as a model for affirming relationships based on respect rather than self-interest.
