

Are we there yet?

As Christians, we individually and collectively swing between two poles, either underestimating the sufficiency and power of Christ's work for us through his death and resurrection, the gift of eternal life and yet, on the other hand, overestimating our experience of those benefits in this life as we await our complete redemption. It's quite probable that some in the Corinthian church had erred on emphasising the latter and the Judaizers harassing the Galatians the former.

Here in Colossians Paul is absolutely clear about what Christ accomplished for us on the cross in securing our salvation, in blessing us with every spiritual blessing and giving us eternal life. Paul is also clear as he teaches about the Christian life in light of Jesus' ascension and eventual return that we're not there yet. This is what Paul means by our life in Christ being hidden, just as his divinity on earth was hidden. This does NOT mean that the Lord gave up some of his divinity while on earth but that he laid aside all the rights and privileges that came with it in taking on our humanity, that glory appearing briefly in its fullness on the Mount of Transfiguration.

When he returns, only then will we see that full glory in him and experience something of it for ourselves. In the meantime, we live in two worlds, in this world marked by sin, suffering and death and the world to come marked by imperishability, glory and purity. Any who claim we've made it, living lives completely free of illness, temptation and want are liars and deceivers. Our contentment lies in the inheritance secure in Christ that we await as we strive to follow him.

Karrinyup Anglican Church will be having a MORNING TOGETHER on Saturday 27th July from 9.30 to 12.30 to enable us to have fellowship around the Word of God, and to learn from one of Western Australia's best known and loved Evangelical teachers, David Seccombe.

After providing significant leadership to St Matthew's Anglican Church in Shenton Park, David moved, nearly 30 years ago, to Cape Town, South Africa, to be Principal of George Whitefield College, which has been a crucial centre for the equipping of gospel workers across Africa.
