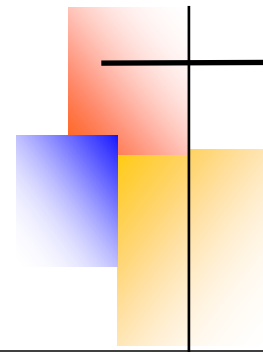

Old Church — New Life

8th November 2020

'DISUNITY IS DEATH'

After we see Solomon at his height, we sadly watch him fall and leave behind a long and heartrending legacy. The people of God, Israel, becomes a divided nation. The division proves to be both political and spiritual. Jeroboam becomes the first king of Israel to the north because Solomon's son Rehoboam is foolish and selfish. The hope would be that Jeroboam becomes the kind of king David was at his best because Rehoboam is little better than Saul was. Sadly for fear of the ten breakaway tribes returning to Judah, Jeroboam dares, without divine sanction, to set up another tabernacle for the worship of the Lord, replicates the abomination of the golden calf and only succeeds in leading Israel into apostasy and idolatry. It is a legacy that will endure for centuries because they had lost sight of the covenant God made with them as children of Abraham.

For modern readers the sadness is that such disunity that so damaged the people of God also continues to damage the church. For us disunity appears in one of two forms, obvious and subtle. The first arises when we falsely make an issue that is not as crucial as belief in Jesus' resurrection or the authority of scripture just as crucial. Too often protestant churches especially have divided over matters that simply were not worth it. Churches divide over personalities or cultural differences, over toxic shibboleths and it does us no credit. The second form of disunity is a false unity, a unity grounded NOT in the covenant we enjoy together by virtue of faith in Jesus Christ but in denominational structures, false or lesser doctrines or personalities and so forth. We think we're unified, and we may be up to a point but eventually the cracks show, the divisions form and the Babylonian unity Luther speaks of becomes painfully apparent.

In our life together and in the Diocese and Anglican Church we are reminded that our prime and essential foundation together is our Lord Jesus Christ, crucified and risen, nothing more and nothing less.

COVID-19 UPDATE

1. We can now have up to 100 people attend provided we keep 1.5 metres apart from each other aside from couples and families. The chairs will be spaced accordingly. Communion will still be of one kind and good hygiene should be maintained before, during, between and after services. We will refrain from physical contact for the sharing of the Peace for the time being.
